
## "Where Will We Experience the Divine in Our Time?"

#### Matt's Message

A little over a week ago, our board of trustees held a board retreat, spending most of the day getting to know each other better, coming up with ideas and ultimately a covenant on how to work together, and then coming up with goals for the board for the year.

Kriss, our board president, wrote last week about those goals (you can see his article <u>here</u> if you missed it). Certainly those goals are an important work output of the

retreat, but I think retreats are valuable for the other, less tangible benefits. I belong to the board of another organization. When I joined I encouraged that board to hold a retreat, but they decided not to, feeling that a retreat would be time consuming, and wouldn't be that productive. I felt that was unwise, and am worried that we are seeing the difficult fruits of that decision. One of the key executives on the board resigned suddenly. There has been conflict (there is always conflict, don't get me wrong), but that conflict has been difficult to work through. That board must deal with serious challenges in the organization, and I worry that they may not be up to the task.

I am grateful that our LCUUF board committed to a retreat, even though we struggled to find a date that worked for everyone. I am grateful to Kriss, who stepped up to facilitate the retreat (we didn't have money in the budget for an outside facilitator, which is usually preferred). He did a great job. I'm also grateful to other board members who provided a meeting place, and food and drink for the retreat. I do feel that the retreat has helped prepare our board for the work we face in the coming year, and that you now have a stronger board as a result.

On another note, I will be away from Lakeside from May 11 through July 6. Part of that time will be in North Carolina with Liz, and with other family members whom I haven't seen since before the pandemic. Part of that time will be hiking and exploring in Spain, primarily in the Pyrenees and Picos de Europa.

My arrangement with the board as a part-time minister allows me to be away four months a year. During some of that time, I will still be working; for example, I'll lead two services

while I'm in North Carolina. During the rest of the time, I'll be on vacation, and relatively out of touch.
