Board Names Special Task Force to Search For A New Location For LCUUF

On Sunday, August 6th the board convened for a special meeting to review and assess the situation with the loss of our lease and prospects for finding a new facility. At the meeting the board appointed a special task force to conduct and manage the search process. They have been very busy. Here is an update:

The Search Team has identified criteria and reviewed them with the Board. So far, 34 locations are on the Task Force spreadsheet. Search range: Realtors, religious organisations, theater groups,



movie theaters, eventos, restaurant spaces, private schools. General criteria listed below:

Sharing or holding the lease Lease 3-5 yearsSpace for seating for ~100 Location Between Chapala and West Ajijic Parking spaces for handicap and general

Cost range for lease - \$6,000 - *\$20,000 per month Secured in order to keep equipment on site

Billions of people around the world lack adequate access to one of the essential elements of life: clean water. Although governments and aid groups have helped many living in water-stressed regions gain access in recent years, the problem is projected to get worse due to global warming and population growth. Meanwhile, a paucity of international coordination on water security has slowed the search for solutions. Water stress can differ dramatically from one place to another, in some cases causing wide-reaching damage, including to public health, economic

development, and global trade. It can also drive mass migrations and spark conflict. Now, pressure is mounting on countries to implement more sustainable and innovative practices and to improve international cooperation on water management.
