justice, and mutual support among its members, and emphasizes the importance of empathy, understanding, and a commitment to the well-being of each person. What inner strengths and skills can we develop and what physical resources are needed to continue creating a beloved community of our fellowship? How far-reaching the rewards? This Sunday begins our two-month Pledge Drive.

"Building Community"

Beginning October 29th we will begin our annual pledge campaign..."Building Community" and we will be using the image on the right as we report progress, rather than a thermometer. The reason for choosing this image is to bring forward the idea of participation rather than exclusively talking "money." This image was created in 2022 by 12-year-old Anja Rozen, a



13-year-old primary school student in Slovenia. She was chosen from 600,000

children around the world to create a piece of art to show what peace looks like. Here is her explanation:

"My drawing represents the land that binds us and unites us. Humans are woven together. If someone gives up, others fall. We are all connected to our planet and to each other, but unfortunately we are little aware of it. We are woven together. Other people weave alongside me my own story; and I weave theirs," said the young designer.

As in past years, we will hear LCUUF testimonies from members about why they belong to our community and what it has meant them. We will also be sharing those testimonials through "News of the Week" as well as updates on campaign progress. For the month of **November**, we are supporting **Operation Feed**. For over 30 years, Operation Feed volunteers have been providing food and improving the lives of the very poor and marginalized people of the village of San Juan Cosalá. They provide weekly food despensas to 150 families and individuals who would go hungry without the aid. Operation Feed also supports new program initiatives like cooking classes and crochet projects to involve the people in developing additional income sources and skills.
