#1 Danza del Sol

In March, 2006, we begin in a garden restaurant at Danza del Sol. Francine, the owner of Mel's, gave us the space without rent. We did not own anything. We used a candle for a chalice. We had an accordionist, Corinne, for music.





#2 Pedro's Gourmet

By September we moved to Pedro's Gourmet, owned by Peter Palmer, now owner of Go Bistro. We did not pay rent. Peter did ask that if we ever took a collection we donate some to an orphanage on the south side of the lake. This was our first social action. We now owned a chalice, the small chalice that we sometimes use. We had a boom box for music. We had our first sermon by a real minister.

#3 Jewish Synagogue

We moved to the synagogue, home of the Jewish congregation, in April of 2007. We finally had a space for Sue Kelley's donated piano. We paid rent for the first time. Janice Kimball and Teo Urzua donated a banner made by Francisco, and Steve and Sue Barr donated our joys and concerns candelabra and our chalice. Sue Kelley and I donated our Michoacán embroidery. We adopted our bylaws and had our first membership ceremony.





4 Sol Y Luna

In the spring of 2014 we moved to two rooms at Sol Y Luna. We had walls but no windows. We started to acquire furniture and we could decorate to suit our needs and taste. Again, everything was donated. Sharon Woods oversaw the design and acquisition of furniture. You can start to see hints of our current home.

5 251 Hildalgo-Current Home

In 2017 we moved to our current home. This was a good place for us, but we are outgrowing it and it is time for what I hope is our next to the last move. Since 2017 we have grown in numbers and in technology. We have gained a professional music director, and a real minister. We have also gained many wonderful new members.


