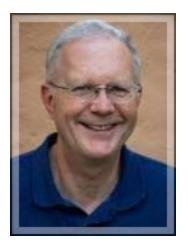
# "Spaciousness of Belief"

Well, we made it through our first full service at our new location, Saint Andrews church!

I'm trying to pay attention to all the things, large and small, that may shift and change as a result of our move. We are in a fluid time! But things will have a tendency to settle into patterns, to solidify, and we should be mindful as to how they do settle.

This reminds me of other major life changes, such as a house move. It's easy for initial decisions to become patterns or habits. I still go to certain shops in Riberas, which is where we first landed when we moved to Lakeside, because I either like the shopkeepers or know their products. Or maybe because I haven't bothered to find vendors closer to my current home.

In the same way, the move of our fellowship invites, even imposes, changes in what we do. For example, last Sunday, I was able to use one of Saint Andrews' body pack microphones, the kind where the microphone slips over your ear, and you can walk around as you speak. I found that ability to move around gave me more freedom and energy as I spoke. I also noticed that using that microphone brought back memories of previous congregations where I had access to that technology, and in some way, I found myself channeling a

younger Matt as a result. I don't know if that came through to you in the audience; for me, it was invigorating.

On that first Sunday, we also experimented with a different way to do joys and sorrows. Our coffee hour is certainly vastly different. And we may have to revisit some of our old policies, like allowing dogs (the St. Andrews campus supports a couple of cats.)

In this time of fluidity, each of us may have our own personal decisions to make: Do I join friends for coffee hour before the service and then go to a late lunch after? Or do I prefer to arrange brunch before the service and then have a little coffee after? It's good to be thoughtful, even curious — individually or as a group — as we explore various choices.

In this fluid time, let's be mindful of the patterns we create as we live into the new space. Let's also be mindful that we share the space with the folks at Saint Andrews as well as Bare Stage. I am certain that interacting with them will at times require some artful and creative compromise, but will ultimately be rich and beneficial for us.

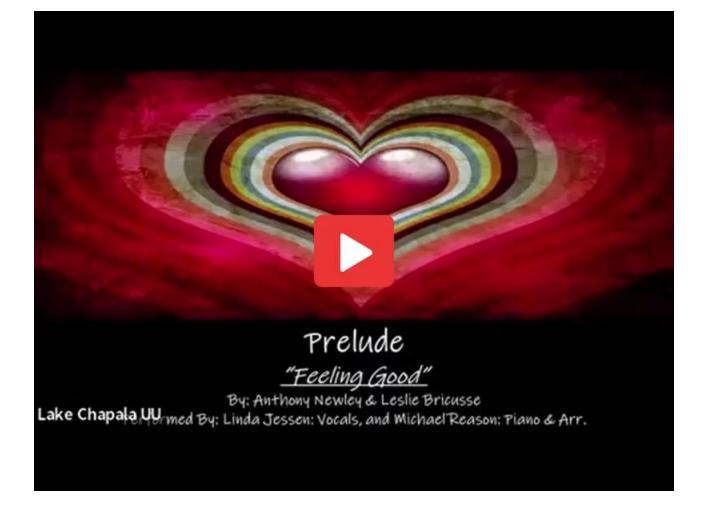
## A New Time And A New Beginning
