"We all wonder about God," Mary said. "Who is God? What's going to happen when we die?"

Help Beyond The Basket

In August the LCUUF Board approved a special donation to our Share The Basket partner Foodbank Lakeside to help with an emergency repair for the kitchen that provides daily hot meals to those in need in San Antonio and Ajijic. Here is the story I wrote for the Foodbank Lakeside Newsletter.

One of the most endearing aspects of living Lakeside is experiencing what a caring and generous community this can be (by local and expat residents). Whether it is aiding victims of flooding or mudslides, rescuing animals or preparing and delivering food to those without proper resources, the good people of Lakeside will be there.

Here is another example of how El Proyecto was saved from having to interrupt their work preparing and providing food to the poor, elderly and home-bound in San Antonio and Ajijic.

For those not familiar with El Proyecto, Emily Alison described how it began in an article she wrote about the organization in the July issue of the Foodbank Lakeside newsletter.

"El Proyecto was established in 1988 by thirteen women. These women saw a need and determined to meet that need. After six or seven years there was a pause in services due to a lack of resources. An Anglo gentleman, Tom, who worked with DIF, found resources to help with the fixed expenses of the project. A couple of charitable organizations chipped in. Local churches stepped up with contributions. A stove, a refrigerator, food, and enough funds to cover electricity and gas became available."

Recently however their water delivery system at the Centro Communitario in San Antonio had degraded to the point where they were about to lose all access to water, which meant no food would be prepared and the 100+ local recipients would be left with nothing.

Fortunately, Foodbank Lakeside, who they have partnered with since Foodbank's founding, put out the call for help to the community and within weeks secured the funds to make the repairs to the water system in order to keep the cooks cooking. Answering the call were the Lake Chapala Unitarian Universalist Fellowship, members of the Ajijic Hiking Group and an anonymous donor.

Under the supervision of volunteer Gary Jenanyan the entire delivery system has been replaced and is now operational. Alicia Garcia, a tireless and invaluable member of the El Proyecto team, found a system that included a 1000 liter vertical tinaco (not available Lakeside or in Guadalajara) through Mercado Libre. Before this new system they had only a trickle of water from the street system. Now the new delivery system stores and delivers clean water at a normal high pressure through their now upgraded filtration system. And because of the quick response to the request for donations, the project was completed without any interruption to the food preparations or deliveries. Dona Maria, who is in charge of the kitchen is very pleased!

El Proyecto has been solidly supported since its founding by the local as well as expat communities. Time and time again the generosity of the Lakeside residents has provided exactly what is needed, when it is needed, even when it something as mundane and uninspiring as a plumbing system.




