



## **December Board Report**

Your Board of Trustees met for their December meeting on Monday December 16th. Present were President Kriss Gang, Treasurer Al Castleman, Vice President Ted Fahy, At-large members Paula Odom, Catherine Luria and Cate Howell and guests Larry Pihl-nominee for treasurer in 2025 and Dee Dee Camhi and Bob Koches representing the Sunday Service Committee. I have asked that the Sunday Service Committee have a representative at each of our board meetings as a way to improve communications between our two groups.

In addition to monthly reports, Treasurer Al Castleman reported that last Sunday' pledge push yielded great results and as of December 20 we have received pledges totally 85% of our targeted goal from 60% of our pledge units (an individual, family or couple). He reported that this will help greatly toward preparing the 2025-2026 budget. He also reiterated that a more important goal was to receive a pledge from 100 of the congregation. If you have not made a pledge or contacted Al with you intentions, you still can do so. We also had a discussion about expenditures yet to be detailed for the new budget.

The board also took time to discuss the formation of a Finance committee/team to take on the responsibilities of managing all financial business for the board. The plan is to have a committee in place during our next fiscal year.

Finally, I presented a "draft" report on the results from the recent congregational survey. We received 62 responses from a membership of around 90 members. A reasonably good response rate. Here are highlights from the report:

**General Interest** 

We received a very positive rating for Fellowship services and activities. We received a rating of 8-9 out of 10 for important areas like quality of services, Fellowship activity engagement experiences and overall satisfaction with the LCUUF—very reassuring results.

For future services, the topics of interest we should take into account for future service planning are interesting. In order of preference they were:

- Mexican history (43%)
- Death and dying (35%)
- Theological studies (35%)
- Hunger and poverty (21%)
- Spirituality (21%)

Regarding other activities members would like to see, unique suggestions included: walking groups, book club group, monthly or quarterly gatherings like the holiday gatherings, brown bag lunches after services, trivia night and more small group discussion groups.

#### Sunday Services

The overall rating for Sunday Services was very positive with 72% of the respondents indicating a 8-10 out of 10 level of satisfaction. When asked if you would like to help participate or prepare a service, again a majority of 58% indicated they would be willing to prepare a service. 40% said they would participate as a reader, 47% as a researcher and a surprising 45% said they would help out as a greeter. All very encouraging results. One area for improvement which was mentioned multiple times was regarding our hymns, specifically the desire for more "singable" hymns or song leaders-both of these issues are being addressed by the Sunday Service Team.

#### Demographics

A majority of respondents (80%) live here full time, another 12% are here part of the year. More interesting is that there are roughly an equal number of respondents falling into each category for number of years as a member. One interesting demographic change is that a majority of respondents have a previous history of attending a UU congregation. For the last survey 3 years ago, only about a third of respondents had previous UU experience. In this survey a third of the respondents had no UU experience. Finally

In the last question, do you have any comments or suggestions, there were 34 written responses mostly complimenting Rev. Matt, the community, the services and the

welcoming atmosphere. There was also appreciation expressed for the fact we were doing the survey. One good suggestion that stood out was about focusing on who we are as a congregation and what are our goals and vision. This is something the board will definitely be addressing in 2025.

As I reflect back on this past year, I believe we have been blessed with abundance and success. However we have unfortunately lost too many dear members. We successfully navigated a move to our new space at St. Andrews and have enjoyed many new collaborations with their congregation. Our membership has increased (slightly) and we are financially sound (which I was never able to report at my last congregation) We truly have a blessed community.

Just a final reminder that our board meetings are open to anyone. We meet on the third Monday of the month at 1:30, usually at a board member's home. Also be sure to mark your calendars for our Annual General Meeting on Sunday January 19th following the service.

- \$ 500 pesos will provide a home bound person meals for 2 weeks


We will of course accept donations at what ever level you feel comfortable.


## For The Love Of Chocolate and LCUUF




